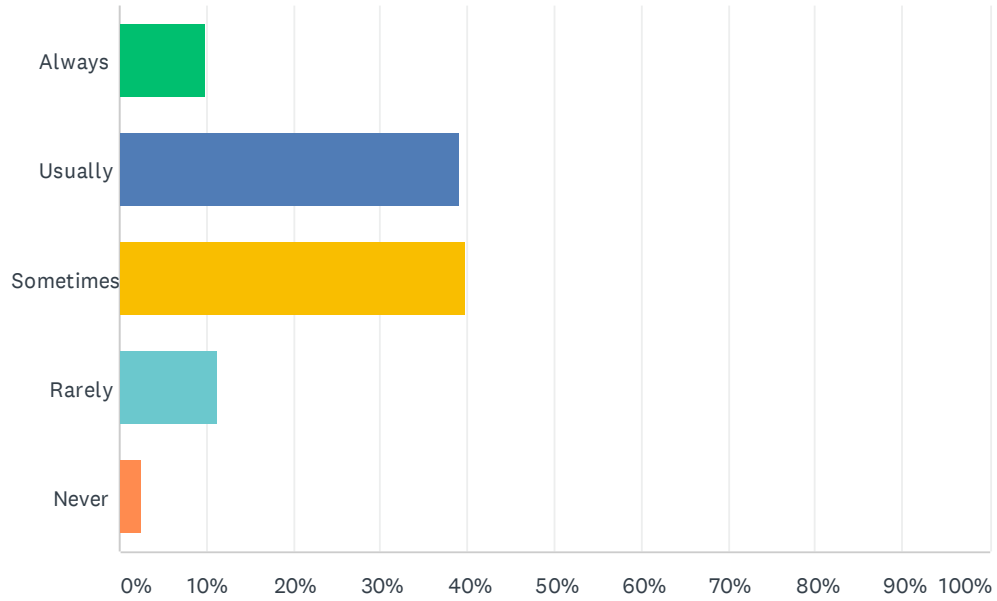


Q1 Do you think religious minorities are treated with respect and consideration in your community?

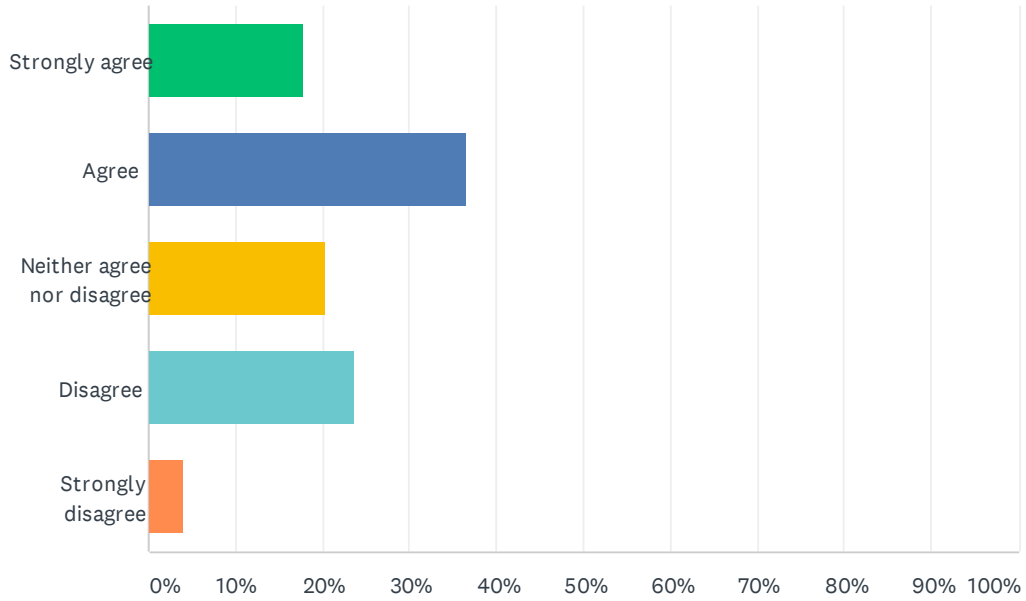

Q2 My community embraces cultural diversity.

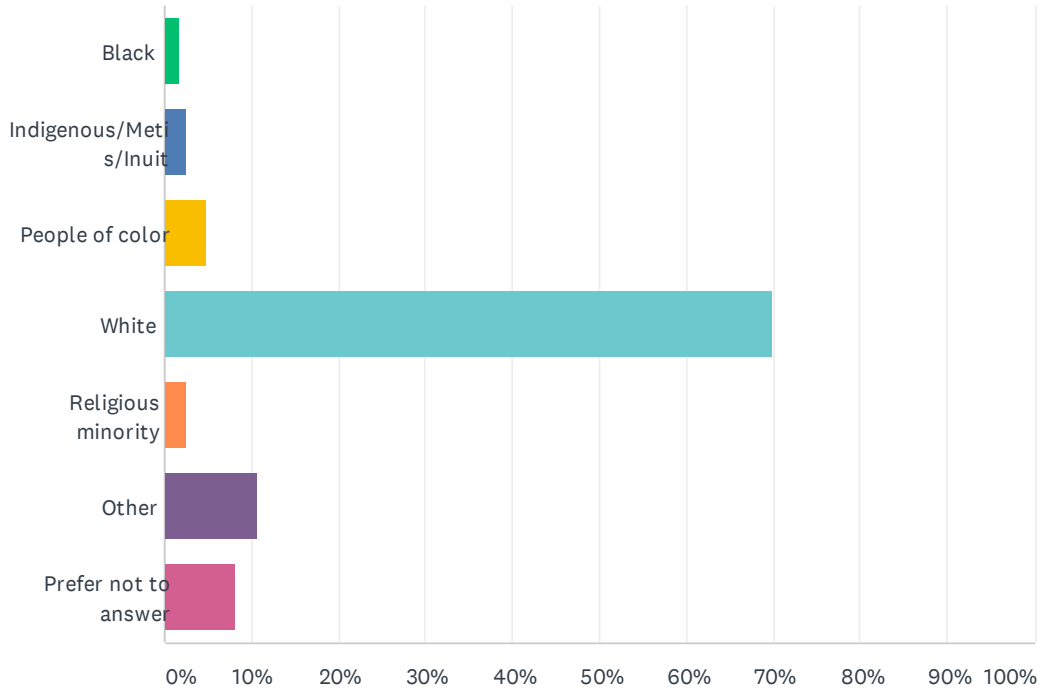

Q3 Which of the following do you identify with?

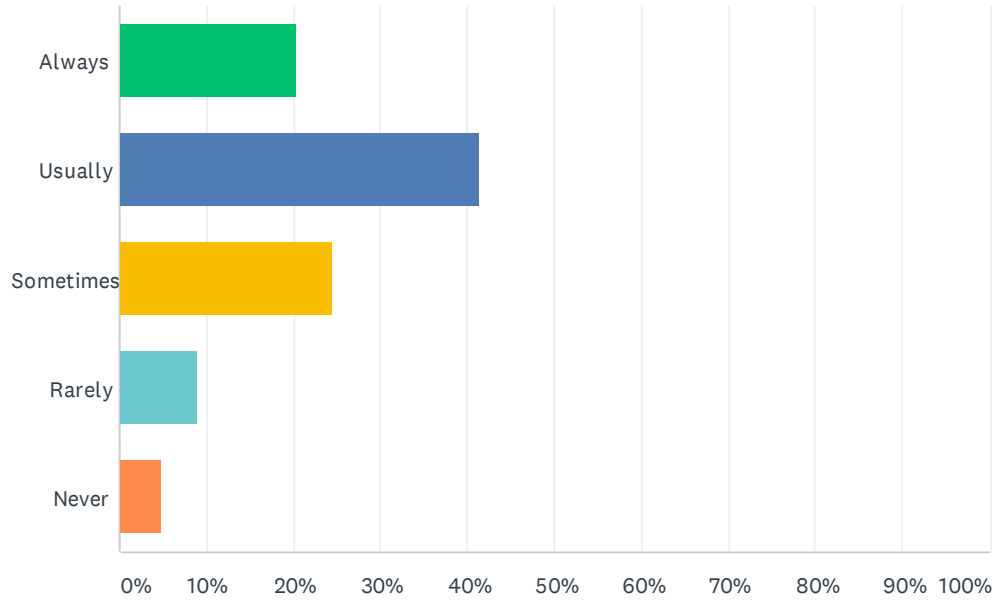

Q4 Do you feel a sense of belonging in your community?

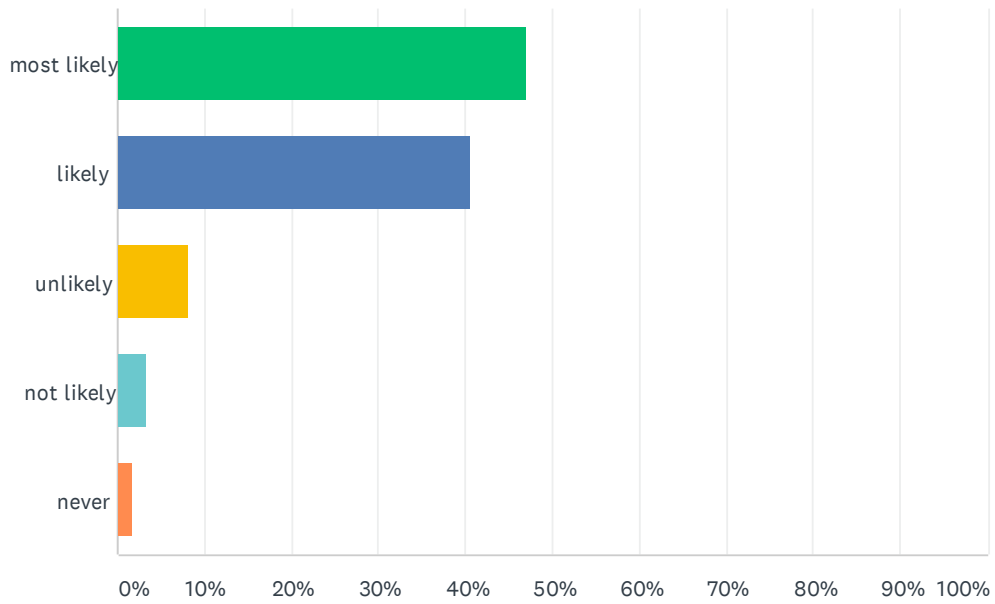

Q5 Would you be comfortable having conversations about racism and discrimination?

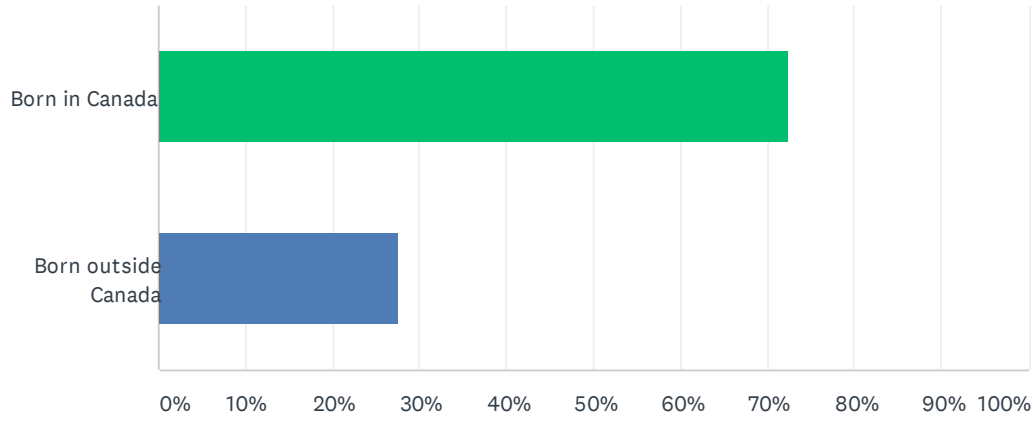

Q6 Where were you born?

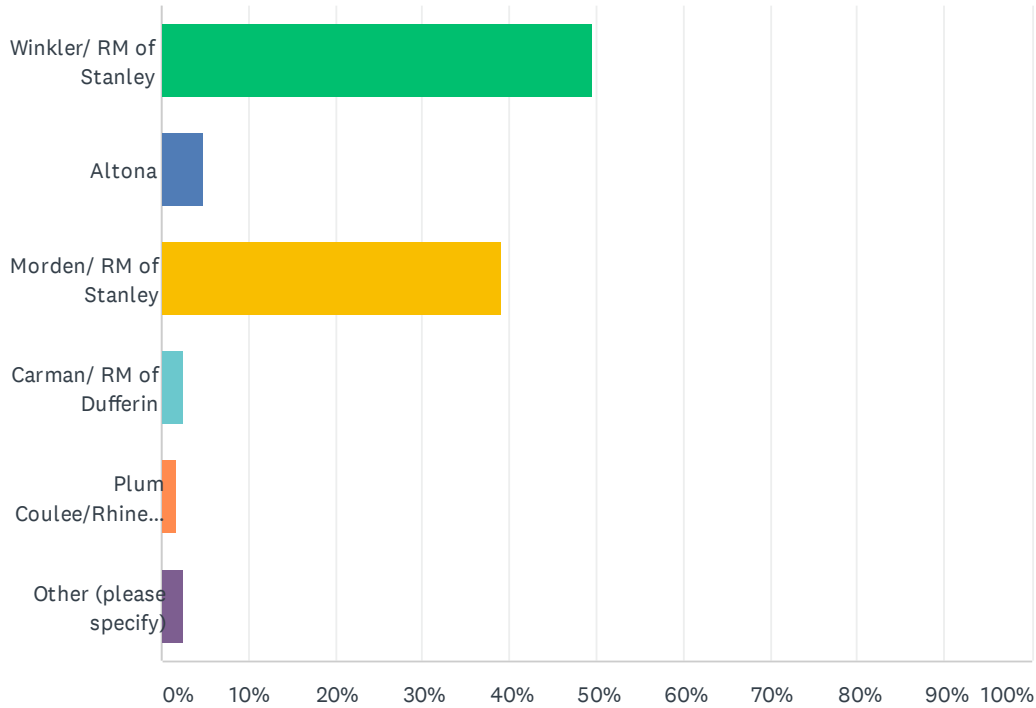
